Accomplishments as NMSU Faculty Senate Chair (2012 - 2013):

- Amended the Faculty Senate Constitution to create a new faculty senate standing committee on government Affairs (Senate Proposition 15-12/13; Signed by the President 4/29/2013).
- Amended the faculty senate constitution (By a Majority vote of all eligible NMSU Faculty in April 2013) to create a standing committee on Government Affairs which would allow for continual monitoring and communication on government activities (particularly regarding the New Mexico State Legislature) that potentially impact NMSU faculty and higher education in general.
- Amended the Faculty Senate Constitution to redefine the role of the senate leadership committee (senate proposition 19-12/13; Signed by the President 4/30/2013).
- Amended the faculty senate constitution (By a Majority vote of all eligible NMSU Faculty in April 2013) to change the name of the Faculty Senate "Committee on Committees" to the "Senate leadership committee" and redefine its role to emphasize the leadership and decision-making functions of this committee comprised of faculty senators selected by their colleagues to represent the various electing groups of the faculty Senate.
- Amended the Faculty Senate Constitution to specify the re-election policy for the Faculty Senate Chair (senate proposition 18-12/13; Signed by the President 4/13/2013).
- Amended the faculty senate constitution (By a Majority vote of all eligible NMSU Faculty in April 2013) to modify the policy for re-electing a sitting faculty senate chair. The previous version of the faculty senate constitution pertaining to Officers (Article VI) was not clear about the term limits and possible re-election of a sitting faculty senate chair. The amended section of the constitution now clearly specifies a two term limit and allows any current chair to be re-elected even if their original term as a senator had expired.

Helped secure an Institutional commitment to a three-year plan to bring all faculty salaries to within a band of +/-10% of the median salaries of our official peer institutions

From November 2011 to April 2013, the Faculty senate working group on compensation met on numerous occasions, drafted a mission statement, and identified a set of objectives that were accomplished over the next two years, including:

- Conducted a formal survey of Faculty concerns regarding salary, (accomplished in November 2012) summarizing faculty input into a "Fact sheet" to be presented to NMSU Faculty and administration" (accomplished in April, 2012, modified in November 2012)
- Held a Campus-wide forum on faculty salaries to present the "Fact Sheet" and to solicit faculty input on challenges faced regarding compensation (accomplished in November, 2012)
- Communicated faculty concerns directly to NMSU Administration and Board of Regents. (accomplished during the 2012-2013 academic year)

In March 2013 the interim NMSU president announced an institutional commitment to a three-year plan to bring all faculty in good standing to within a band of +/-10% of the median salaries of our official peer institutions. This plan was approved by the board of regents in May 2013

Passed 28 pieces of legislation, serving only 9 months as senate chair [September 6th, 2012 to May 2nd.], Legislation passed and signed by the President included:

- Approval of Three constitutional amendments (see above)
- Approval of two new degree programs (PhD in Kinesiology, BS in Counseling & Educational Psychology)
- A resolution to endorse the dissolution of an Academic Program (the College of Extended Learning) and transfer of its functions and resources to the college of Arts & Sciences in accordance with the NMSU policy Manual [Senate Proposition 24-12/13; Signed by the President May, 2013]
- A provisional approval of changes to NMSU policy regarding the "regularization" of part-time faculty who had been continuously employed as "part-time" for two consecutive academic years, allowing them to receive full benefits [Senate Proposition 07-12/13; Provisionally approved by the President December, 2012]
- A proposition recognizing and authorizing the Associate Deans Academic Council (ADAC) as a standing university board within the framework of Policy 1.05.90 of NMSU Policy Manual. Senate Proposition 25-12/13; Signed by the President May, 2013]
- A Memorial honoring NMSU Faculty member Dr. Lucy Sandoval who passed away in February, 2013 [Senate Proposition 12-12/13; Signed by the President December, 2012]
- A Memorial Requesting a Change in Policy Regarding Graduate Assistant Pay Schedule allowing students to receive their first paycheck earlier in the semester. [Senate Proposition 08-12/13; Signed by the President December, 2012]
